**Are we considering some may need:**

**Physical**    Sight..... Large Print  
                  ..... Print Alternative to screen  
                  ..... Better contrast on screens/avoid distracting backgrounds  
Hearing..... Microphones used all the time, even for informal gatherings  
                  ..... Portable microphone for outside/non-wired rooms  
                  ..... Word captions for videos  
                  ..... Hearing Aid interface  
Mobility..... Ramp access across thresholds  
                  ..... Elevators for multiple levels  
                  ..... Wheelchair turn around space within bathrooms  
Permission to move/stand/fidget in *all* spaces

**Attitude**    Is our attention drawn to what is happening next to us?  
                  Do we expect others to respond like we would?  
                  Do we measure our words to be encouraging?  
                  Are we willing to partner with other organizations to support a specific population?

**Commitment**    Are we able to set aside personal preferences to help another?  
                  Will we plan/attend, even require, training programs to prepare everyone well?  
                  Will we seek opportunities to meet varied needs?

As you think about these things, it may surprise you whom among you may need support on one or more of these points, but have never spoken up. Any medical procedure or crisis can cause these needs. There are many reasons why people do not speak up. They may suffer through or worse, stay home. We can be proactive by asking our friends at church if any of these would be helpful.
